Abundant Life Ministry

Last month, I shared the first part of the Raytown Christian Church's vision: to help people experience deep spiritual development. I spoke about the Directions Discipleship Course and the then upcoming training for DDC Disciplers. There were a total of 22 of us who were trained by the discipleship leaders from the Abundant Life Church in Lee's Summit (our grateful thanks to the AL leaders who invested in our congregation with their leadership, resources, and time). The four-day training course was so well received, that the participants have committed to continuing their training on Monday nights for the foreseeable future.

Currently, there are 35 other church members who have expressed interest in taking the course and our Disciplers will begin discipling them sometime this month. This is a momentous event and I'm excited that we're on our way to meeting our vision with a gusto.

But there's a second part of our vision. Going Deep into discipleship is necessary to build an even stronger foundation for Raytown Christian Church. But a foundation is not a future (though it's a start!). We must build on that foundation and that is what we shall do with the second part of our vision. We will help people experience deep spiritual development *that results in* full and abundant living. Again, I share from the vision narrative:

From there, we developed a short narrative to guide us over the next five years:

Over the next five years ... we will extend the invitation to a full and abundant life to Raytown through the Abundant Living Ministry. The Abundant Living Ministry will provide abundant life training, guidance, encouragement, resources, and a spiritual foundation to help young adults achieve success in their hearts, in their careers, in their families, and in the community.

As the narrative suggests, the Abundant Life Ministry has a three-pronged approach:

1. To help young adults achieve success in their hearts, that is, in their personal lives and especially their spiritual lives. We'll do this by coming alongside these young adults who are committed to achieving personal success and are willing to invest in that success. We will help them find success through goal setting, through escalating responsibility, and through deep discipleship.
2. To help young adults achieve success in their families. We live in a culture that fractures families as carelessly as a tornado through a wheat field. Again, we will come alongside these young adults who are committed to achieving strong families. We will help them find success through mentoring, modeling, and ongoing encouragement. We will provide faith-deepening ministries that help parents to model and mentor faith in their homes, with their children, and with each other. We will help them discover that love is much, much more than a feeling ... it's a commitment of mutual sacrifice, mutual submission, and mutual surrender that creates mutual strength in the face of adversity.



3. To help young adults achieve success in their vocations. In our ministry area, there are literally thousands of young adult men and women who we have been identified demographically as “Achievers.” These achievers want to achieve success in every area of their lives, but most prominently in their vocations. Some of these Achievers want to become entrepreneurs and business owners. Some want to climb the career ladder. And some want to be the best person they can be in their careers. This is the first of the three prongs that Raytown Christian Church will be addressing with the Abundant Life Ministry. Beginning in 2018 and escalating in 2019, the Vocational ALM will grow in three stages.

First, we will invite these Achievers to quarterly seminars that we will host. These seminars will bring in well-known, successful business men and women from around the KC Metro area to speak on motivational topics that will be of interest to our Raytown Achievers. Plans are being made to launch our first seminar early in the new year.

The second stage will be the launch of monthly leadership classes. We expect to feed these classes from the quarterly seminars. The leadership classes will be led by experienced business owners, teachers, entrepreneurs, and leaders from our own congregation.

And finally, the third stage will be the dawn of weekly cohorts of these Achievers who get together to share ideas, set goals, to hold each other accountable for success, and to expand the focus to include personal and family success as well.

Of course, discipleship will be at the core of the Abundant Living Ministry. We believe that faithful discipleship provides excellent success principles for heart, families, *and* business.

A church’s vision is only as strong as its commitment to implementation. To that end, we are creating, implementing, completing, and adding 90 day goals throughout. The first set of four 90 day goals are moving into completion. (1) Our Discipleship Team invited and gathered leaders for our first Directions Discipleship Training Course. (2) The church board is actively following up with our regular worship participants to encourage them to attend worship during the Leap of Faith sermon series. (3) We launched a Discipleship Emphasis beginning September 17th. The last 90-day goal, all staff will star in their own video talking about their experience with the Directions Discipleship Course is yet to be complete ... but we’re still in the midst of the course, so it will be another couple of weeks.

All that’s to say that we’re being intentional in our movement forward with the vision and together, we’ll keep our mission, our values, and our vision front and center of everything we do. Churches that are unified behind a compelling vision and a biblical mission grow. New guests visit. They get involved. They get discipled. They make more disciples. That’s been the pattern for growing churches since the very first church in Jerusalem. It’s a time-honored, God-ordained reality and I’m excited that we’ve taken the first steps.

TRAINING— "GRIEF", October 23, 2017

"We live in a mourning-avoidant culture. Most people have little tolerance or patience with someone who is grieving and that lack of tolerance extends into the church."

Those are the words of **Rev David & Elaine Howlett of Spiritual Grief Ministries**, who will be the guest speakers at our **Care Ministry Training on October 23rd at 7pm.**

David & Elaine have personal experience with grief, having lost a teen-aged son in a tragic accident. They have built on their own difficult experience and have been trained to counsel others who are grieving.

All of us have had experience with grief and some of us may be passing through that trial right now.

We all know others who are in the grip of grief and we have probably struggled with how to counsel and comfort them. Our own desire to avoid grief may lead to a lack of tolerance and patience for the grieving of others.

David & Elaine want to change how grief is typically understood. Grief is natural, normal, and necessary. Mourning is not the same as grief. Someone who has lost a loved one needs a period of time to transition through that loss to healing.

They will focus on how the entire church can be the supportive community that walks with someone who needs our love to help them through the pain and struggle following the death of someone they have loved and still love. Grief is love.

The training session will last about 1 to 1 ½ hours. There will be opportunity after the session to speak personally with the Howletts. Stephen Ministers and Extended Care Caregivers will also have brief meetings after the training.

The training is being sponsored by our RCC CARE MINISTRY, especially for all who serve as Care Givers, but it is open to any and all. Whether you are struggling with your personal grief or with how to help those who are, please plan to attend!

Chili Cook-Off

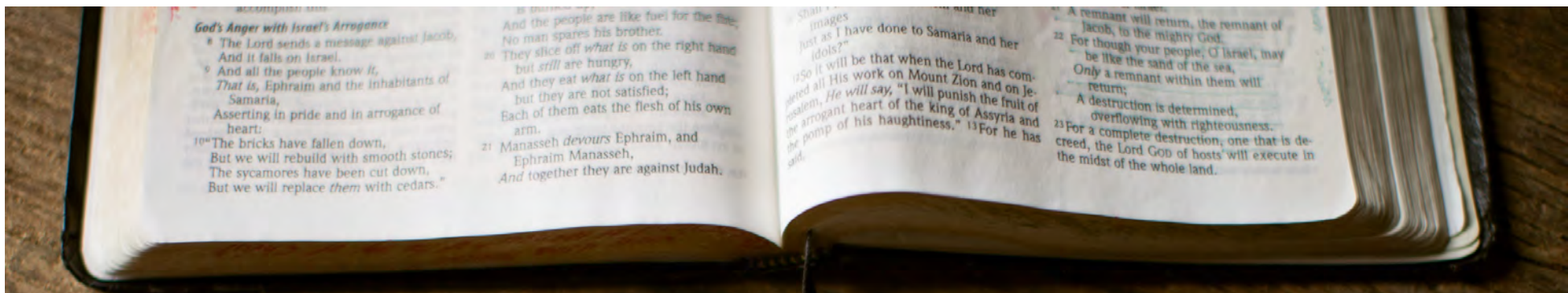
