It's a new year ... and that means every newspaper, radio journalist, television news and news-magazine (an oxymoron on both counts), and every print magazine is going to running scads of articles on the theme *New Year, New You!*

At Raytown Christian Church we don't reserve the New Year for life renewal – we do that all year long. And over the past eighteen months, together we've been strengthening the church's spiritual foundation in our leadership and in the congregation. During that time, we've focused more on building our own discipleship practices than we have on reaching others for Jesus Christ. Too many churches are so focused on growing their numbers that they forget that without strong and faithful leadership and church members, growth is unsustainable.

And so, with the dawn of the new year, the infrastructure at Raytown Christian Church is strong enough to begin building bridges into our community. We're ready, as a congregation, to turn our attention from growing our hearts to reaching the hearts of others.

To that end, we've put together a flurry of activities designed to make it easy to invite our neighbors to experience warm hospitality, to make new friends, and to explore what it means to be a Jesus follower. Below is a list of the "big" events we'll be hosting this year – but all of these are "in addition" to the activities we're already doing.

March: Abundant Living Ministry Seminar

A 60–90 minute seminar on some aspect of Success in the Workplace. Guest speaker and exact date yet to be set.

March 25: Breakfast with the Bunny

A one hour brunch and Easter Bunny photo op between worship services.

April 1: Easter

On Easter Day we'll also be publically relaunching our late-morning worship service.

April–May: Spring Fling Family Carnival

A community wide party for young families. Designed to connect those in our ministry area to our membership.

June: Summer Men's Focus Event

Men are one of the most difficult demographics for the church to reach. Under discussion is the type of event that will draw men ... we're thinking BBQ, car show, sporting demonstrations, or ??

July: Summer Day Camp

Once upon a time, Vacation Bible School seemed to draw families from far and wide – but it turned out that nearly everyone was already in another church! Instead of VBS, we'll be offering a one-week Day Camp designed to stimulate the hearts and minds of children.

September 9: Fall Kick-Off Event

A relaunch of our Children's Ministries and a boost of our Family Ministries.

September 20: Job Fair at RCC

Part of the Abundant Living Ministry, the Job Fair at RCC is being designed to be a personalized blessing to those within a 12 mile radius of the church.

October 27: Family Harvest Festival

More than Trunk-or-Treat, the Family Harvest Festival will help us make real-world connections with young families in our ministry area.

December: Drive Through Light Show and Live Nativity

Details are still being worked out, but we'll leverage our driveway design to begin creating a community light show. On at least one of the evenings, we'll also host a Live Nativity and invite the community to stop by and share a cup of hot cocoa.

December 24: Christmas Eve

Continuing our traditional candle service and expanding our Children's Focused Christmas Eve service.

Most of the dates and descriptions are tentative, but each of these events is in the process of being planned. Our goal is to become one of the most talked-about churches in town, but that will only happen with a LOT of help from you. We're going to need everyone in the church to begin making plans to being a part of these public events. We need visioneers, planners, organizers, managers, and lots and lots of help. And we'll need lots and lots of Word Of Mouth Marketing.

The New Year is the first year where we'll see the church's vision really begin to come to pass.

If God is calling you to get involved in Children's Ministry in 2018 let me know and I will get you connected.






There will be a parent/youth meeting **on January 7th at 12:30 – 1:30 PM for all 6th – 12th graders and their families.** On the agenda will be:

Mission Trip – 2018

The Inspirations will be serving in Christ's name in Red Lake, MN this July. We will be experiencing life on a closed Chippewa reservation. During the week, the youth (6th – 12th grade) will have the opportunity to spruce up homes, build ramps and stairs and to share the Gospel with residents. In return, there will be numerous worship and cultural awareness opportunities for those attending.

The Native populations survive on reservations by pure grit – just as several of the individuals mentioned in the Bible. During the spring semester, we will study the stories where GRIT plays a part in the individual's determination and ability to spread God's love to others.

Those who attend Raytown Christian will have the opportunity to join alongside us by **Sponsoring a Mile** during the month of January. **Each mile will cost \$5.** Those who sponsor will have their names listed in the trip information shared with the youth to include in our daily devotionals. We will pray over our church family while we travel and will invite all sponsors to a luncheon upon our return so we can share our stories.

Youth will be available during Sunday mornings in January at the communication center to register those wishing to sponsor a mile. We look forward to being the Body of Christ to others.

We also thank our church members who took postcards after church on December 3 and shared them with neighbors and friends.





Nativities Around the World Display, Dec. 8 – 10
