Digging Deeper, Going Further

Monday

Read: Genesis 21

- 1. How did Sarah react to the son of the slave woman (Hagar)?
- 2. How did God respond to Sarah's demands?

Reflect: Reflect on a time/event in your life that was difficult, but in which God made a way for you through. What did you learn from this?

Tuesday

Read: Genesis 22

- 1. Why was Abraham so confident that God would provide an alternative sacrifice?
- 2. What did God promise Abraham as a result of his faithfulness?

Reflect: Reflect on your life dreams and purpose. How would they bless others?

Wednesday

Read: Genesis 23

- 1. Why do you think Abraham was so adamant about paying for the land?
- 2. The Hittites said that Abraham was a mighty prince. How did he become such a powerful man in the nation?

Reflect: Abraham's purchase gave him a base from which his ancestors would multiply. How have you leveraged your purpose and dreams to create a legacy?

Thursday

Read: Genesis 24

Note: Abraham makes 2 requests: (1) That his son not marry a Canaanite woman and (2) that once betrothed, he would return to Abraham's land.

- 1. How did the servant fulfill Abraham's dream?
- 2. What difference did it make to Abraham and Isaac that the servant fulfilled his purpose?

Reflect: What are you doing to further your purpose ... and helping others to fulfill theirs?

Friday

Read: Genesis 25

- 1. What was the prophesy about the twin brothers?
- 2. How can you tell from this chapter that the twins were at odds with each other?

Reflect: Although one person's God-given dreams and purpose may be at odds with another's, God's ultimate purpose can encompass both. How do your dreams/purpose intersect with others?

Saturday: Who will you invite to worship with you tomorrow?
