The campaign committee has carefully reviewed and prioritized projects, getting competitive bids and keeping watch over the contributions as they come in. We have prioritized 5 items on the original list we shared. Repairing, re-sealing, and re-striping the parking lot is the first project. We are also collecting proposals for the second priority; repairing the roof and repainting the metal part of the roof to prevent leaks. Stripping and waxing the main floors was already in the property budget, but our campaign funds will provide beautiful new entry mats to protect the freshly waxed entrances. Next, we will discuss options with an engineer about kitchen upgrades and repairs. And finally, we will meet again to strategize the remaining projects as well as create a fund for emergency repairs.

God sure is good! He is moving among us, nudging us to be the church He wants us to be.

Because of you, RCC – His house is going to be tended to and improved to continue to be a welcoming space for you, those who visit, those who also call RCC home & the greater community of Raytown/Kansas City.
