As you can imagine, this is not sustainable and cannot be our Plan A.*

But there is hope! We are all in this together as Disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ. Like the original disciples, we are here to share our celebrations and our trials as a family would, and to address challenges together. Like Peter, we must not be afraid to jump in to solve problems! Joshua 1:9 says "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

We will move forward fearlessly, working and contributing generously for the future of Raytown Christian Church, and for each other!

Some Disciples of Christ History

Time for another history lesson from the ol' history teacher. This lesson is not about Raytown Christian Church, in particular, but rather the history of the Disciples of Christ. The DOC denomination began in 1832 with the merger in Lexington, Kentucky of the Barton Stone and the Alexander and Thomas Campbell reform movements, now known as the Stone-Campbell movement. Both movements had sought to eliminate divisiveness within the Protestant churches and hoped for unity of all believers. Stone wanted to continue using the name "Christian", while Campbell wanted "Disciples of Christ". For many years, both names were used, and, to some extent, still are today. In the late 1860's, there arose a dispute within the church about the use of musical instruments, specifically organs, in worship. Some said only instruments that were identified in the New Testament could be used, while others said any instruments not prohibited in the New Testament could be used. This, along with an issue over missionary work, led to a split and by 1906 the Churches of Christ had become a separate denomination.

In the Disciples of Christ churches, individual congregations are seen as independent and autonomous, thus sometimes DOC churches may be slightly different. However, there is commonality in most areas. Disciples of Christ is characterized by a focus on New Testament teaching, shared governance between clergy and laity, baptism by immersion, ecumenism, and the regular celebration of communion during worship. Each Disciple congregation determines the nature of its worship, study, Christian service, and witness to the world. Through belief in the priesthood of all believers, Disciples also practice freedom of interpretation among its members. Early on the church adopted the slogan "In essentials, Unity; in non-essentials, Liberty; and in all things, Charity." Later on, the church adopted the phrase "No creed, but Christ."

Both of these are attempts to reach out to all believers, regardless of denomination. The essentials are that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, who died and rose from the dead, and that we accept him as our savior. One non-essential could be baptism. While DOC practices baptism by immersion, other forms of baptism are recognized as acceptable.
