### Who We Are

### Beliefs of DOC

### An Open Table:

The Lord's Supper (communion) is celebrated weekly and is open to all who believe in Jesus Christ.

### Freedom of belief:

Disciples are called together around one essential of faith: the confession of Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. While disciples are free to follow their consciences guided by the bible, the Holy Spirit, study and prayer, they are also expected to extend that freedom to others.

### Believer's baptism:

### The unity of the church:
