The Raytown Summer Lunch Program has begun! Raytown Christian Church members continue to support this program both financially and in service, along with many other area churches and volunteers. The RSLP bases operations out of Raytown Christian Church, which provides space for storing and packing individual grocery sacks of food (150 per week). Families picking up their groceries come to RCC's parking lot for distribution of their groceries. We offer ourselves in service to these children to support and pray for their needs. No child should go hungry because school lunch isn't available in the summer.

The World Cup is coming to KC in 2026!

The Raytown Faith Leaders, along with KC Faith Leaders, have begun meeting and brainstorming in planning preparation for the World Cup next summer. Many topics will be discussed, especially logistical issues. Raytown Christian Church is approximately one mile from the stadium, so there are several topics we should be aware of. For example, thousands will be visiting our area, and what do we have to offer? How do we bring in these visitors to our church services to hear God's word? Will we prepare for additional children visiting? Will we offer food to those who show up hungry? SUMMER LUNCH MINISTRY

Your food for breakfast and lunch is in the bag! Raytown Summer Lunch Program continued...

Raytown Summer Lunch Ministry's mission is to provide nutritious and kid-friendly meals to children during the summer months when they are not in school receiving school meals.

The Raytown Summer Lunch program began nearly 20 years ago by our Pastor Dawn along with church members at Raytown Christian Church. In the beginning, we provided individual sack lunches for the children of the Raytown School District for the six weeks between the end of summer school and the beginning of the new school year. We drove to the parking lots of area Apartment Complexes or Parks with the lunch sacks and distributed them.

Now, instead of receiving individual sack lunches, families of students drive up to R.C.C. and receive one sack of breakfast and lunch meals per week. The sacks are distributed for 11 weeks during the summer months.

In the summer of 2024, 1,766 Raytown Student's Families were provided with weekly sacks of groceries. WOW!
