- Be the light that reflects Christ's love in every corner of your life.



It's November, and Raytown Christian Church members have opportunities to share God's love with so many people, and especially children, this Holiday Season!

Our first opportunity is **Sunday, November 23**, when our wonderful bakers bring desserts to the church for the River of Refuge's Transitional Housing community. Those desserts will be delivered the following Monday for their annual Thanksgiving dinner. Thanks to all of you who bake (or buy) desserts for this special event for the families living there!



That same Sunday is the beginning of the Prison Fellowship Ministry's Christmas Angel Tree program. The Angel Tree will be filled with Angel Tree gift tags that can be taken from the tree by one of God's "angels," who purchase a present for the child represented on the tag. I haven't bought a child's gift for my child in many, many years (she's now 42!) and it's so much fun shopping for the "littles!" Caregivers will have been called and Christmas presents suggested, so that takes some of the guess work out of shopping. This special program ensures that presents from an incarcerated parent or family figure will reach their children, along with a personal note from that parent. (RCC becomes God's angels for shopping, wrapping and delivering these gifts to the kids.)

By Sunday, December 7, Angel Tree gifts will have been bought, wrapped, and returned to Outreach. RCC's "Angels" will sort and deliver the presents to the children's caregivers on Saturday, December 13, with caregivers handing out presents to children from their incarcerated parent or family figure member!

Jesus was God's gift to the world, and we honor that gift by giving our gifts of love to others.

During these difficult times of government shutdowns and budget cuts, we lift our leaders and country in prayer. Many people are struggling, hungry and ill. Please keep praying for those in need.

The Outreach Team has included a Food Resource list at the end of this month's Christian Pilot.
