
Raytown Christian Church is filled with amazing people who share with those in need, following Jesus' command to *love one another*.

## RCC's Inclement Weather Policy

## Understanding Charitable Giving IRAs with Dave Sprick



Did you know that you might have the opportunity to contribute to RCC by transferring money directly from your IRA using a strategy called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)? Even though the new Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) age is now 73, QCDs can begin at age 70 ½. Unlike a regular distribution from an IRA, a QCD is not a taxable distribution. The net effect is an increased gift to RCC AND reduced income taxes!

Lots of abbreviations, and sounds complicated, but it is not. If you are older than 70 ½ and have an IRA talk to your accountant or financial advisor or feel free to discuss with me how you might benefit by using this giving strategy.
