- 1 Thessalonians 3:12

We'd like to share a quick, simple explanation of praise music, especially why it repeats more than traditional hymns.

Praise music is designed to be easy to sing, easy to remember, and easy to join in. The repetition isn't there to fill space; it's actually intentional. When a line repeats, it gives people a chance to slow down, breathe, and let the words sink in. Instead of juggling lots of verses, the heart gets to focus on one clear message.

And this idea isn't new at all. It's actually very biblical. The Psalms repeat all the time. For example, **Psalm 136** repeats the line "*His steadfast love endures forever*" in every single verse. That repetition was meant to help worshipers remember God's character, speak truth out loud, and let it settle deeply into their spirits. Praise music today is doing the same thing just in a modern style.

It's kind of like saying a short prayer a few times in a row, not because you forgot it, but because each time you say it, it goes a little deeper.

Hope that helps explain the heart behind it.
